

## Drop off your hazardous household rubbish at the HazMobile

The HazMobile will operate between 10am and 2pm on:  
Saturday 27 August 2011 - Public car park on Elliot Street,  
near the RSA and Ray Small Park.

### Hazardous household waste includes:

- ✓ Furniture polish and shoe polish
- ✓ Car products such as petrol, oil and batteries
- ✓ Kitchen and oven cleaners
- ✓ Wood preservatives
- ✓ Pool chemicals, bleach and disinfectants
- ✓ Garden chemicals such as fertilisers and pesticides
- ✓ Toilet and drain cleaners
- ✓ Glues
- ✓ Gas cylinders.

### The HazMobile will not take:

- ✗ Paint (except for lead-based paint and marine antifouling paint).  
**Note:** Other types of paint and paint tins can be taken year round for reuse or recycling to Resene Colorshops (see [www.resene.co.nz/paintwise](http://www.resene.co.nz/paintwise)). At Resene Colorshops, Resene-branded paint is free to return. A small charge applies to other paint brands to cover handling, recovery and recycling costs. Conditions apply to the return of paint tins. Please see the Resene website for more details.

## Your inorganic rubbish collection 2011

### When?

Put out your inorganic rubbish on the **Saturday and Sunday** before your collection week (see the dates listed above). It should be put out no later than 7am on the Monday of collection week.

### Where?

Place your inorganic rubbish on the grass verge, or the footpath if your street has no grass verge. Keep piles clear of driveways, fire hydrants, trees, power and telephone poles.

### How?

Put metal objects (including fridges, washing machines and stoves) in a separate pile because different trucks will collect different items. For safety, remove doors from stoves, fridges and other appliances and remove power cords from faulty electrical items.

## Getting your inorganic collection right

- Don't put out items that are too heavy or too large to be lifted by two people.
- Securely wrap any fragile or breakable items (preferably in thick cloth and packing tape). Tape over television screens to prevent the screen from smashing.
- Don't put out any of the following:

- ✗ Building or trade rubbish such as concrete, bricks, rubble, wood, glass or any building or demolition rubbish. Take these to your local transfer station.
- ✗ Garden rubbish such as grass clippings, tree and hedge trimmings. Compost these, take them to your local transfer station or get a garden bag company to collect them.
- ✗ Paint – take water or oil-based paint products and paint tins for reuse and recycling to Resene Colorshops. Conditions apply – see [www.resene.co.nz/paintwise](http://www.resene.co.nz/paintwise). Lead-based and marine anti-fouling paint should be taken to the HazMobile. See [www.hazmobile.govt.nz](http://www.hazmobile.govt.nz) for details.
- ✗ Car products such as batteries, petrol and oil. Take these to the HazMobile (see the HazMobile collection dates listed later in this brochure or visit [www.hazmobile.govt.nz](http://www.hazmobile.govt.nz) for further information).

- Used engine oil can also be taken in a sealed leak-proof container to oil recycling drop-off bins throughout Auckland for free disposal. See [www.oilrecycling.org.nz](http://www.oilrecycling.org.nz) for your nearest drop-off bin location.
- ✗ Recyclable materials such as paper and cardboard, glass bottles and jars, steel, tin and aluminium cans, and plastic containers from the kitchen, bathroom and laundry marked with any of these symbols:



- These items should be put in your recycling bin for the weekly kerbside recycling collection.
- ✗ Hazardous household items. Take these to the HazMobile.

## Remember

The inorganic collection is for residential properties only. 'Inorganic rubbish' means any item that cannot be recycled, is too large for the weekly rubbish collection and is not hazardous.

Almost all of the material that you place out for the inorganic collection goes to landfill. Please think of other means of disposing of useful items such as donating reusable items to charities, second-hand shops and clothing bins.

Inorganic rubbish placed on the kerbside is owned by the person putting the rubbish out. Auckland Council takes ownership of the rubbish at the point of pick up. Items are to be neatly stacked and placed on the street or grass berm in a manner which does not endanger pedestrians or obstruct footpaths or access ways. Tidiness of the materials is the responsibility of the person putting out the rubbish.

### Illegal dumping

It is illegal to put rubbish outside any property other than your own. If you witness illegal dumping, please contact the council on 09 301 0101 to report it. If possible, please provide the time, date, vehicle description and registration number. If you are able, take a photograph of the offender in action.
